Third Sunday in Lent

We hear in the first reading for the Third Sunday of Lent the question posed to Moses by the Israelites in the desert: “Is the LORD in our midst or not?” In this question, we come to a deeper understanding that the season of Lent calls us to look for ways to find the Lord in our midst.

Within the story line of the Book of Exodus, Israel was in the beginning stages of their desert journey. They had just crossed the Red Sea that God miraculously parted, narrowly escaping the advancing Egyptian army. But within a relatively short period of time, the Israelite community began quarreling among themselves and grumbling against Moses; the lack of food and water unsettled the Israelites. And so, they challenged Moses and his leadership: “Why did you ever make us leave Egypt? Was it just to have us die here of thirst with our children and our livestock?” The Israelites even tested God, asking Moses: “Is the LORD in our midst or not?” Moses pleaded to God for intervention, and God responded by empowering Moses to use his staff to strike on the rock in Horeb, drawing water from the rock for the people to drink. The Lord was indeed in the midst of the community during the desert journey, but the Israelites’ grumbling and complaining blinded them to the Lord’s presence.

In today’s Gospel reading, Jesus meets a Samaritan woman at a well and initiates a dialogue with her with a simple request: “Give me a drink.” In John’s Gospel, true discipleship involves first and foremost bringing others to Christ. In this regard, the Samaritan woman models the ideal behavior of a disciple because once she believes that Jesus is “the Christ,” her response is to go to town and bring others from the town of Sychar in Samaria to Jesus. Ironically, the disciples, upon returning from town with no one but themselves, failed in their opportunity to evangelize, to bring others to Christ. Because of the woman’s evangelization, the Samaritans came to see the Lord in their midst.

As we continue on our Lenten journey, we can use the Samaritan woman as a role model for discipleship. We, too, are challenged to find the Lord in our midst and bring others to him.
